



## Norwegian start-up wins AmCham EU Female Entrepreneur of the Year Award

***The American Chamber of Commerce to the EU (AmCham EU) and JA Europe recognise the next generation of female leaders at Europe's largest entrepreneurship festival, Gen-E.***

*Brussels and Vilnius, 15 July 2021* – The American Chamber of Commerce to the EU (AmCham EU) and JA Europe announced today that **Maria Wathne, CEO of the student start-up Paramate, won the AmCham EU Female Entrepreneur of the Year Award 2021** at Gen-E, the European Entrepreneurship Festival. With this year's focus on female entrepreneurship, AmCham EU and JA Europe aimed to send a strong signal that Europe needs more women in leadership.

Ms Wathne is a 26-year-old entrepreneur, mother of two and innovation student at Kristiania College Oslo. She impressed the jury with her ambition to tackle a key issue for the aquaculture industry as well as her drive to make her start-up and team thrive. Paramate develops sensors and connected software that enable fish farmers to monitor the level of hydrogen sulfide on their land-based farms, preventing outbreaks of the toxic gas and promoting better management of resources and the environment.

**Susan Danger, CEO, AmCham EU**, said: *'Underrepresented groups, including women, have been hit hardest by the impacts of the Covid-19 pandemic. By creating this Female Entrepreneur of the Year Award as part of our annual Youth Entrepreneurship Award scheme, our hope is to support the dreams and ambition of young women. Representation matters and I am proud we can help Maria inspire the next generation of female entrepreneurs.'*
